Three Rivers Heritage Trail System

All Port Authority bus routes are equipped with bike racks. Visit portauthority.org to view a video on using the bike racks. Bikes can also be brought aboard the T or Mon Incline at any time and stowed in the designated wheelchair spaces. However, riders in wheelchairs have priority over bicycles.

BIKE SHARE COMING 2014

Bike share, a system of bicycles available for short-term use by annual or short-term (24 hr) members, will launch in 2014. The 500 bikes, designed to be sturdy, vandal-proof and safe, are used for "point-to-point" trips and can lock into any of the 50 solar-powered stations planned throughout the City of Pittsburgh.


