

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO WLU BOARD OF GOVENORS June 3, 2020

- It was a commencement to remember as West Liberty University celebrated the Class of 2020 in a first-time ever virtual ceremony presented by Topper Station, WLU's streaming platform on Saturday, May 9. Special thanks go to Theresa Gretchen and Jason Koegler for the production. A live graduation ceremony is planned for later this year.
- MacKenzie Davis, a 2017 graduate from the WLU nursing program, volunteered to travel to New York City at the height of the pandemic to work in the ICU at NYU Winthrop, a 591-bed facility that is located in Long Island. She said, "Honestly, going to New York just felt like the right thing to do. I didn't have any reason not to go. I'm healthy, young, and have the necessary experience and education to make a difference in the best way I know how."
- Due to COVID-19, the Phi Beta Lambda State Conference took an online format and students presented their work in a virtual setting.
 WLU emerged with several winners. All students attending the leadership conference are enrolled in the Gary E. West College of Business. They will join hundreds of America's college students in a virtual national conference and competition next, later in June, which offers thousands in cash prizes.
- West Liberty University plans to have in-seat classes for Fall 2020 and reopen its main campus and Highlands Center location, along with housing and dining services. Multiple scenarios and plans for opening are being developed.
- West Liberty University received a gift of 500 surgical masks from business contact Joanna Dongmei Jiang, who is the president of C3 Summit International. Jiang is located in Shanghai, China and she sent the masks to help the university during the pandemic.
- The West Liberty University Critical Incident Response Team (CIRT)
 has been meeting regularly during this crisis to identify safety

measures and precautions on campus and to implement the West Liberty University "Response to Pandemic Event" policy. Using the most current CDC and local public health and safety data, the CIRT team is currently addressing issues of safety with the incoming Physician Assistant class, scheduled to begin classes on June 29.

- Fred Kinder, a member of the West Liberty University Wall of Fame, worked with his alma mater and others to bring a rapid test system to West Virginia. Kinder does business throughout Asia and was familiar with a rapid test developed in China by Ustar. This test detects pathogenic microbes (such as COVID-19) from patient samples (nasal swabs, sputum, and other bodily fluids) in a matter of minutes. "This is a state-of-the art test capable of rapidly detecting COVID-19 without the need of extracting the viral genetic material or any additional tedious steps," explained Joseph Horzempa, Ph.D. Horzempa is a WLU biology professor and microbiologist who was named West Virginia Professor of the Year in 2018 and has gained national attention for his research.
- Senior women's tennis standout Carleyah Mclean won the ITA's Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award for the Atlantic Region, while the Lady Hilltopper team earned the ITA's Atlantic Region Community Service Award. The ITA's Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award dates back to 1982 and is presented annually to the male and female student-athlete who have exhibited outstanding sportsmanship and leadership, as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements. Off the court, she served an internship at the Wheeling (W.Va.) YWCA where she worked to assist homeless individuals and individuals seeking shelter from domestic violence. As a regional award winner, Mclean is now one of eight finalists for the ITA National Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award while the Lady Hilltoppers are finalists for the ITA National Community Service Award. Both awards will be announced later this month.
- Each and every spring, students are singled out for awards at Spring Convocation and this year was no different. Despite the pandemic and the nature of our virtual world, these annual awards were presented virtually. In addition, the Digital Media Design Students presented their annual Senior Art Show virtually. Upcoming virtual

programs include a Physician Assistant Open House and Summer Freshman Orientation.

 Construction continues on the fourth floor of Campbell Hall. The Behavioral Health Lab and Speech Pathology and Audiology Lab are scheduled for completion in August. The water leaks near the student union have been repaired. Installation of LED lighting throughout campus has begun with retrofits in the Library and Main Hall.

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
