Significance:					
The paper explains why someone

gap. A gap may be an under-					
researched topic, an unresolved					
question, unexplored implications					
of a theory or finding, etc. Simply					
stated, the paper attempts to add					
something new to the					
conversation.					
ORGANIZATION/STYLE					
Controlling Idea:					

The paper remains consistently focused on a main idea or ideas. The sections and paragraphs work together to provide ample evidence for/elaboration of this idea.			
Reader-based Organization: The paper uses specific features including transitions, topic sentences, metacommentary, etc.			
to effectively organize information in a reader-friendly way. The paper does not contain			
mechanical or structural errors that interfere with reader comprehension.
